A Letter from Christopher Mercado

Hello, my name is Christopher Mercado, and I am a doctoral student at National University. I am conducting a research study to examine the instructional experiences of high school guitar teachers who received little or no guitar education from their university degree program. I also seek to understand how these teachers believe their instructional experiences have been impacted by their minimal training.

I am recruiting individuals who meet all these criteria:

- 1. Hold a current teaching license in Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Delaware, Pennsylvania, or DC.
- 2. Currently teaching in a public high school in the above states/DC.
- 3. Currently teaching at least one beginning-level guitar class.
- 4. A holder of an undergraduate degree from a university music education program.
- 5. Received three or fewer credits in university courses that were primarily dedicated to teaching them how to teach guitar in a classroom setting.
 - Any credits from classes that were not directly focused on guitar but that may have had applicable skills to classroom guitar instruction do not count toward the three or fewer credits criteria.
 - Supplemental guitar lessons as a part of the university program do not count toward the three or fewer credits criteria.

If you decide to participate in this study, you will be asked to do the following activities:

- 1. Complete an in-person or virtual one-hour interview at a mutually agreed upon time.
- 2. Teach one lesson while observed in-person.
- 3. Share at least one class document with me to view.
- 4. Complete a follow-up discussion to verify that all interview and observation findings are represented accurately in the research.

During these activities, you will be asked questions about:

- The training you received in college related specifically to teaching classroom guitar.
- Your perceptions on how your preparation impacted your experiences teaching classroom guitar.
- The curriculum and resources you use to teach guitar in your classroom.
- The processes you use to prepare, execute, and reflect on your lessons.
- Growth you have experienced as a teacher over your time teaching guitar.

Participants in this study will receive a \$100 Amazon gift card via email after the follow-up discussions.

Over the last three years the Virtual Guitar Orchestra (VGO) has produced some amazing videos showcasing All-State and Honors Guitar Ensembles across the country as part of its MEA project. These video projects (supported by the Augustine Foundation) played an important role during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic and continue to serve as an advocacy tool for music education.

Virginia students were able to participate in our first Regional Guitar Ensemble, our 2021 All-Virginia Guitar Ensemble and the 2020 and 2021 NAfME National Honors Guitar Ensembles. The VGO is now producing Regional Ensemble videos. Participating states include Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina and Virginia. Students do not have to have been in an All-State, Regional or District event in order to participate. This is open to all who are interested.
